

SIM-Card Regulation and the Role of the National ID


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The National Communications Authority (NCA) is the regulatory body for the communications sector in Somalia.



NCA was established through the Communications Act of 2017, and its mandate is to regulate the Communications and Technology Sector.



NCA is responsible for:

- Development of ICT Sector
- enabling and ensuring fair and sustainable competition
- carrier interconnection
- Consumer Protection
- Promoting Investment in the ICT Sector



Current Approach of SIM Card Registration



Telecom Operators use whatever identification is available



Passport, Immigration ID Card, and Birth Certificate are all used in the registration.




If not available, Telecom operators use a guarantor method

SIM Card Registration

Mandate by the Law

- The National Communications Authority (NCA) has been legally mandated to implement the SIM card registration process as stipulated by the National Communications Law.
- This initiative is in line with the government's broader objectives to enhance national security, protect consumer rights, and ensure the integrity of the telecommunications sector



Role of the National ID

- One of the critical requirements for completing the SIM card registration is the possession of a National ID.
- The National ID serves as a unique identifier, ensuring that every SIM card is registered to a verified individual, thereby reducing the risk of fraud and misuse.
- This process ties individual identity to communication services, creating a robust system for monitoring and regulation.


